

CREFC Overview: Foreign Real Estate Ownership in the U.S.

(Updated 4.15.2024)

Executive Summary: In 2022, CFIUS determined it did not have the authority to review an acquisition of land by Chinese-owned Fufeng Group, near a military site in North Dakota.

- While some states already had laws on foreign real estate investments prior to the decision, this case
 influenced more states to consider laws to limit the purchase of real estate or agricultural land by foreign
 entities in the United States.
- Many of the state bills refer to foreign principals or adversaries and ban them from holding land near a military installation or critical infrastructure facility, but many emphasize the role of China and their real estate investments in the U.S. Some also specifically ban foreign principals from holding agricultural land. Several states have passed laws limiting the acquisition of agricultural land or real estate.

There has also been an influx of Congressional bills introduced which address national security concerns associated with the purchase of U.S. real estate or agricultural land by foreign adversaries, or direct CFIUS to conduct reviews of investments in the U.S. made by foreign adversaries.

- Most of the bills introduced have been referred to the appropriate Committee.
- However, two have been marked up: <u>H.R.3378</u>, the Agricultural Security Risk Review Act, introduced by Rep. Frank Lucas (R-OK); and <u>H.R. 5409</u>, the Safeguarding American Farms from Foreign Influence Act.
